

Verb Density Graph of "The Story of Khunawlei and Nawmuey"





Verb Density Graph of "The Story of Thawmepa"





Verb Density Graph of "The Story of Mueyaephae"





Verb Density Graph of "The Story of Phue Mawtaw"





Verb Density Graph of "The Story of Nyali"





Verb Density Graph of "The Story of the Brave Orphan"





Verb Density Graph of "The Story of the Strong Orphan"




